## 2012 National DPAC FEATURED PHARMACIST







The Florida A&M University (FAMU) National Alumni Association (NAA) designated Dr. Frank S. Emanuel as Distinguished Alumnus at its annual Distinguished Alumni Awards ceremony on Friday, April 27th in the FAMU Grand Ballroom.

Dr. Emanuel earned his bachelor's degree in pharmacy in 1971 from the FAMU School of Pharmacy (now the College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences), and his PharmD in 1976 from the University of Tennessee.

Dr. Emanuel secured more than \$1 million in contracts and grant support from the Florida Department of Health over the past five years. He was also a major player in an investigative team with the FAMU College of Pharmacy that was awarded a grant of more than \$400,000 by the U.S. Department of Defense to research prostate cancer among African-American males.

He is the 2006 recipient of the Distinguished Service Award presented by the National Diamondback Pharmacy Alumni Council.

In October of 2011 Dr. Emanuel was inducted into the North Florida Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Alumni Hall of Fame.

In 2009, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity honored him with its second highest award of achievement, "The Elder Watson Diggs Award", named for one of their most revered founders at the 71st Grand Chapter meeting in Washington, D.C.

He was also honored in 2000 as a fellow of the American Society of Health Systems Pharmacists (FASHP). Dr. Emanuel has been married to 1969 FAMU School of Business alumnus, Hattie Thompson for more than 45 years. They have 2 children and 3 grand-children.
