Vernon Dwayne Parker RPh, Ph.D.

Vernon Dwayne Parker was born on Sunday, October 19, 1947, to the late Ernest and Hattie Parker in Newark, NJ, as the third of their four children. Known to his family as Dwayne, he and his siblings were raised in the Newark area, making frequent summer trips to Orlando visiting his family. While in Newark, he attended the local public schools making many friends. His mother used to say that he never met a person he didn't like. As a child, he accepted Christ in his life at Mt. Calvary Baptist Church, in Newark, NJ.

In 1965, he graduated from South Side High School, then attended Florida A&M University (FAMU) where he received his BS Pharm degree in Pharmacy in 1970. Upon graduation, Vernon worked as the Director of Pharmacy Services for the John A. Andrews Memorial Hospital at Tuskegee Institute. While at Tuskegee, he married Zenobia Boddie in 1973. From their loving union they welcomed their son, Khary, into the world in 1975.

During his time at Tuskegee, Vernon also earned his master's degree, in 1977, from the Tuskegee Institute School of Veterinary Medicine, majoring in Pharmacology and Physiology. He then returned to his alma mater, FAMU, to serve as the assistant to the Dean for Administrative Affairs and as an Assistant Professor for Pharmacy Administration. With a desire to make an impact in pharmaceutical science, in 1979, he moved his young family to West Lafayette, IN, to pursue his Ph.D. at Purdue University. It was during this time that they welcomed their daughter, Tabia, into the world in 1981.

In 1983, Vernon received his Ph.D. in Clinical Pharmacy from Purdue University College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. Now as Dr. Vernon Parker, he returned to his alma mater to serve as Director in the Division of Clinical Pharmacy at the Florida A&M University, College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences from 1983-1988. Following his tenure at FAMU, Vernon continued to have an illustrious career in the pharmaceutical manufacturing industry, as a clinical research scientist at Wyeth Research Laboratories, in Radnor, PA, outside of Philadelphia. While at Wyeth, he participated in the development of numerous drug products currently being marketed around the world today. In addition,

he received several prestigious awards, at Wyeth, for his many research accomplishments. In 2005, after serving for 18 years at Wyeth, Vernon retired and returned to Orlando, FL.

While in retirement, in 2008, Vernon married Paulette Parker, who was ever present and always by his side. During their time in Florida, they enjoyed traveling and taking cruises. He also enjoyed boating and deep sea fishing.

Vernon was a dedicated servant of The Lord. While living in the Philadelphia area, he served as a member of Monumental Baptist Church. Before he retired, he served with the Bethel AME Church AIDS Task Force in Wilmington, DE. He started a program there to help their clients understand and properly administer AIDS medications. During retirement, he served at Faith Point Church, in Clermont, FL, as a member of Project Manhood, a male mentorship program. He also received his Certificate of Ministry from Kingdom Revelation Ministries, School

of Ministry, in November 2017. Shortly thereafter, he and Paulette served as members of Rejoice in the Lord Ministries, in Apopka, FL.

As part of his service to the Lord, Vernon also served his community. In the early 1970's he was initiated into the Omega Psi Phi, Fraternity, Inc. Recently, he served as Chaplain for the Chi Tau Chapter (Orlando, FL). He also served in many other organizations in various locations helping the African-American community.

Vernon was called Home to be with Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on January 2, 2020. His memory and his legacy will be carried on by his beloved and devoted wife, Paulette, their three blended children: Khary Parker, Devon Richardson, and Tabia Parker; four grandchildren: Taylor Richardson, Naomi Parker, Mykah Parker, and August Lisenbee-Parker; siblings: Eleanor Thomas, E. Gerald Parker, R.Ph, A. Brian Parker; and a host of loving other family members and friends.
