Summary of the Year

- **Thanks to all the members of the Membership Committee for working to recruit FAMU pharmacy alumni to consider joining NDPAC. We appreciate the new members that joined us for the first time as well as the renewing members for this year. It was truly a team effort. President Sharon White's goal was to reach 200 members. We did not make that goal but as of today, we have a total of 126 financial members. Membership cards with a folder detailing the mission of NDPAC were distributed to members in a timely manner.**

Summary of the Year

- We sponsored an incentive drawing to give 3 members NDPAC gear if they became financial before October 30, 2021.
- As an incentive as a member of the NDPAC, the CoPPS, IPH Department of Pharmacy Continuing Education provided a 20% discount off the registration fees for the Clinical Symposium.
- Tampa Bay Chapter is in the process of revitalizing.
- President Sharon White made a Faculty Alumni Appeal for Membership.
- We were able to process and distribute membership cards to 104 out of 124 graduates of the CoPPS. IPH class of 2022.



Goals for 2022-2023

Recommendations for Student Membership

- The recommendation is to continue to offer one-year free membership to new graduates.
- Provide an incoming and outgoing function for the P4 students at each of the campuses to introduce them to the alumni and the NDPAC. The local chapter in the area where the campus is located will be responsible for providing the functions. At the function we can obtain their contact information to keep them engaged and provide their membership cards to them before they leave the rotational campus.
- Provide community service hours for assisting with events sponsored by the NDPAC, that are not a part of their required activities.
- Continue to sponsor the Leadership Skills seminar for student leaders.
- Become a regular presenter at the Forums sponsor by CoPPS, IPH. Have the local chapter coordinate the presentations with the college and provide presenters.
- Sponsor student leaders to attend our annual meetings.
- Investigate ways that the alumni can be more visible and engaged with the students from P1 to P4.

Recommendations for Chapter Assessments

Since most active chapters are not able to pay the assessment as recommend in the by-laws and we should not deactivate any chapter that can't make this obligation, the recommendation is to reduce the amount so all chapters can contribute to NDPAC and still have monies to sponsor local events. It is recommended that National develop a budget for upcoming year, assess the dues amount, and goals to determine what is needed for the organization to function efficiently then determine a reasonable amount to assess Chapters.
